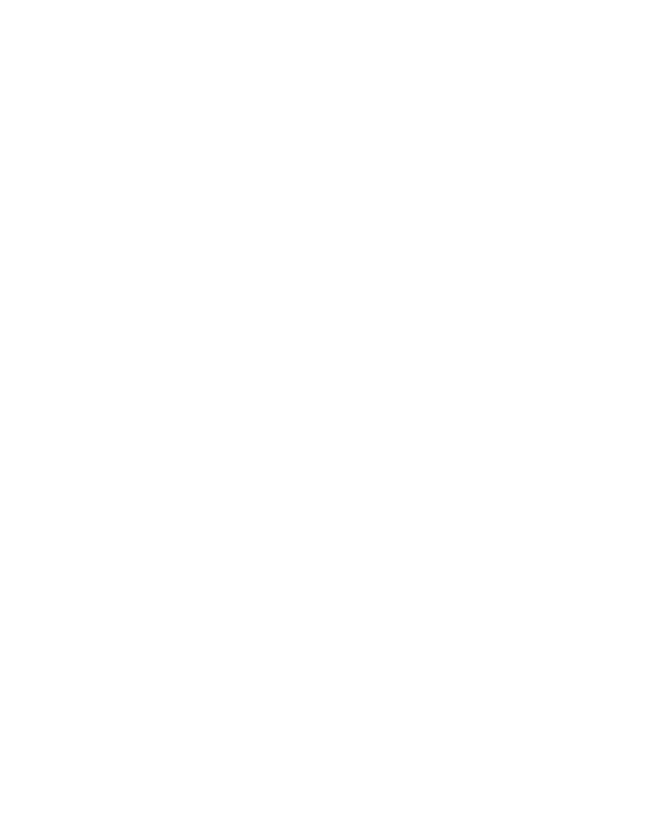

COMMUNION AND VISITS OUTSIDE MASS



THE FOLLOWING ARTICLE IS THE FOURTH IN A SERIES PROVIDED BY GOOD SHEPHERD'S SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE ON THE TOPIC OF GUN VIOLENCE:

Addressing Gun violence in our culture.

A seven-part series from the G.S. Social Justice committee

Part 4. Guns and Gun Safety- What do you think?

In part 4 of this series, we focus on opinions related to gun violence, gun ownership and laws. A Pew Research study in 2023 reported that approximately 80 % of US adults say gun violence is a big (60%) or moderately big (20%) problem. Parents of K-12 students say they are extremely worried (19%) or very worried (13%) about a shooting happening in their child's school. Yet gun violence remains at or near all-time highs. According to Small Arms Survey, some 393 million guns are owned privately in the US, greater than the US population. In 2021, Pennsylvania ranked fifth among states in registered guns (348,167 guns). Approximately 40% of US adults live in a household with a gun and 32% personally own a gun (Pew Research). Three quarters of gun owners say they own a gun primarily for protection while fewer owners own a gun for hunting (32%), sport shooting (30%) or their job (7%). The country is split in its thinking of guns as increasing safety (49%) versus decreasing safety (49%) by giving too many people access to guns and increasing misuse.

Laws governing firearms are predominantly instituted on the state rather than federal level. Laws vary from state to state and even from city to city within states. Pew Research reports that 50% of US adults favor stricter gun laws with 26% saying laws are about right and 15% favoring less strict gun laws. Differences in opinion concerning gun ownership, significance of and how to address gun violence and gun legislation occur between gun owners and nonowners, males and females, Republicans and Democrats, "conservative" versus 'liberal" leaning within their respective political parties, and urban versus suburban versus rural. Whatever your opinions concerning guns, you are not alone. Such divisions have made change to gun laws extremely difficult to enact in many states, including Pennsylvania. Gun legislation addresses age to purchase, type of firearms sold and magazine size allowed, background checks, safe gun storage, and extreme risk protection orders. These legislative initiatives aim to decrease gun violence in our nation. Some of these elements are being actively debated in the Pennsylvania legislature and will be addressed in Part 5 of our series.


