DIVINE MERCY FOR DOUBTING THOMAS

"... do not be unbelieving but believe." John 20: 27

Sometimes we refer to Thomas the Apostle as doubting Thomas, because of him doubting Jesus' resurrection. He was not doubting for very long, though. The resurrected Jesus reached out to Thomas only a few days after his resurrection and offered him both spiritual (his mercy) and physical (his body) proof that he was alive. Jesus treated him not with judgement or condemnation for not believing, but with mercy. After this experience Thomas was able to say to Jesus that He was Lord and God. What enabled Thomas to say this, but not just say it but live that profession of faith, for the rest of his life? What does it mean to us, who believe in Jesus' resurrection, to say and to live those same words?

Once again, we were fortunate enough to offer during Lent fish dinners and they were quite successful. CRS SPOTLIGHT

With no safe space left, Gaza has become one of the most dangerous places in the world for civilians. For almost 6 months, the people of Gaza have been subjected to unrelenting deadly violence from which they have no safe haven. There must be an immediate end to the violence that has destroyed the lives of millions of people. Even as families follow evacuation orders, bombings follow their path. The crisis calls not only for peace, but for the right to exist. Severe access constraints continue to pose a major challenge for people to receive life-saving aid especially in northern Gaza, which has been isolated from assistance for months. More aid must get into Gaza as soon as possible, through as many channels as possible, and in quantities that can reach as many people as possible, with less restrictions on access and movement. CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

The US Bishops found that there is a need to increase the awareness of the faithful of the social teachings of the church. Therefore, the Good Shepherd Social Justice Committee will review the 7 key themes of Catholic Social Teaching in a series. As the USCCB has written, "Catholic social teaching is a central and essential element of our faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called God's people to a covenant of love and justice. It is a teaching founded on the life and words of Jesus Christ, who came "to bring glad tidings to the poor... L+iberty to captives ...recovery of sight to the blind"(Lk 4:18-19), and who identified himself with "the least of these," the hungry and the stranger (cf. Mt 25:45). Catholic social teaching is built on a commitment to the poor. This commitment arises from our experiences of Christ in the Eucharist. "

"Our social tradition has been developed and expressed through a variety of major documents, including papal encyclicals, conciliar documents, and episcopal statements. ...many Catholics do not adequately understand that the social teaching of the Church is an essential part of Catholic faith."

"Catholic social teaching is based on and inseparable from our understanding of human life and human dignity. Every human being is created in the image of God and redeemed by Jesus Christ, and therefore is invaluable and worthy of respect as a member of the human family. Every person, from the moment of conception to natural death, has inherent dignity and a right to life consistent with that dignity. Human dignity comes from God, not from any human quality or accomplishment."

"Central to our identity as Catholics is that we are called to be leaven for transforming the world, agents for bringing about a kingdom of love and justice. When we pray, "Thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven," we are praying for God's kingdom of justice and peace and committing ourselves to breaking down the barriers that obstruct God's kingdom of justice and peace and to working to bring about a world more respectful of human life and dignity. "

A JAMAICA MISSION REFLECTION, by Ray Vautour

We visited our sister parish's house over spring break. We had not visited since the beginning of Covid. Six parishioners from Good Shepherd parish along with six family and friends made the trip to Maggotty, Jamaica. The ride to the house provided an adventure of twisting roadways, a mix of lush beauty and littered roadways, wealthy homes and small shacks. We were warmly welcomed by Father Marek, Marta and the 3 Sisters. The whole family got together (approximately 250 in attendance) for Mass on Sunday to pray, share a meal and sing with joyful voices. The mission looks great, built for gathering of family. Like any house, there are always projects to be done so Dave, Rick and Bill climbed bunkbeds or scaffolding to rewire and change out about 50 florescent lights to LEDs. And like any house, things break. A mysterious gaping hole appeared in the basketball hoop backboard which the team repaired. Insects destroyed a cabinet which housed medicine in the clinic. Andy and Jayne built a huge new cabinet. Life can be challenging where our brothers and sisters live. Unemployment still is about 75% and people scrape by. Members of the family are getting older. Carina, Ali, JoAnn and Ray spent time with our Jamaican sisters & brothers in the clinic, listening to stories of painful knees, backs and shoulders; stories of falls and emotional struggles and offering any support they could. Several afternoons brought the overflowing energy of the kids who enjoyed line dancing with Ali and Carina and basketball camp with Dave and Rick. Other afternoons were quieter, drawing and chatting about school assignments or helping those struggling with reading. Karl brought a 3D printer and taught an excited Hobby club group the potential of this new technology. At the end of the day, we came together with Father and Marta to share a meal and talk about our day, its' joys and struggles and what we had learned in being with our Jamaican family. Life is not easy for the family in Jamaica. But the family in Jamaica is resilient, patient and focuses on gratefulness, which enables them to live with great joy. It is good to spend time with family.




