# CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING THEME 3-RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities--to one another, to our families, to the larger and society. "It frequently becomes clear that, in practice, human rights are not equal for all. Respect for those rights 'is the preliminary condition for a country's social and economic development. When the dignity of the human person is respected, and his or her rights recognized and guaranteed, creativity and interdependence thrive, and the creativity of the human personality is released through actions that further the common good.' Yet, 'by closely observing our contemporary societies, we see numerous contradictions that lead us to wonder whether the equal dignity of all human beings, ... is truly recognized, respected, protected and promoted in every situation.

...While one part of humanity lives in opulence, another part sees its own dignity denied, scorned or trampled upon, and its fundamental rights discarded or violated.' What does this tell us about the equality of rights grounded in innate human dignity?" (*Pope Francis, On Fraternity and Social Friendship* [Fratelli Tutti], no. 22)

"Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry. ... There has been a tragic rise in the number of migrants seeking to flee from the growing poverty caused by environmental degradation. . . . Our lack of response to these tragedies involving our brothers and sisters points to the loss of that sense of responsibility for our fellow men and women upon which all civil society is founded." (Pope Francis, *On Care for Our Common Home* 

[LaudatoSi'], no.25)

"In human society one man's natural right gives rise to a corresponding duty in other men; the duty, that is, of recognizing and respecting that right. Every basic human right draws its authoritative force from the natural law, which confers it and attaches to it its respective duty. Hence, to claim one's rights and ignore one's duties, or only half fulfill them, is like building a house with one hand and tearing it down with the other." 


